**AMENDED ORDER**

Consistent with the May 13, 2021, “Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People” from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, as well as the May 17, 2021, Amended Twenty-First Order Extending Declaration of Judicial Emergency in Response to COVID-19 Emergency from the Supreme Court of Virginia, the Court hereby AMENDS its Order dated May 13, 2020, as it relates to the required wearing of face coverings and social distancing in the Norfolk Courthouse.

All persons who provide proof that they are fully vaccinated (i.e., two weeks after receiving the second dose of a Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, or two weeks after the single dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine) are not required to wear a mask or facial covering and are not required to maintain social distancing while in the courthouse. The Sheriff is authorized to require entrants who seek to remain maskless to display proof of vaccination. Persons without such proof may be required to wear a mask and maintain social distancing.

The requirements of the May 13, 2020, Order remain unmodified as to persons who have not been vaccinated against COVID-19.
