### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

If you have not yet assisted your parents in downsizing their home, chances are you will. Or, maybe you have had the unfortunate experience of cleaning up the family home after your parents have passed away. Currently, my mom is preparing to move into an extremely nice independent living facility. She is therefore downsizing an entire house, and 52 years of memories, into two rooms. My dad passed away two years ago, but I am very blessed that I get to share this time, and this HUGE task, with my mom.

Of course if mom and I could just toss everything without looking at it, analyzing it, and then sharing it with one another, the process would move a lot faster, but we would miss out on so many fun memories. I can also tell you that Virginia in second grade was not very different from Virginia today.

Apparently I never saw the inside of a Hallmark when I was little, but I was well supplied with recycled paper (my dad's sales reports), construction paper, glue, scissors, and markers. My brother and I made cards for our parents for every holiday — and based on the rubber-banded stacks in mom and dad's dressers, none of the cards were ever thrown away.

Mom and dad also saved my letters from college, my studies abroad, and a year I traveled to ten different countries performing in a singing and dancing show with a group called "Up With People." As a young person, I never saw the value in consistent journaling, so I am so thankful that I now have these memories in writing.

Apparently around age 12 or 13, I got a fish tank with fish in it. I do not even recall the fish tank, but apparently I had a concern that my younger brother and his friends would stick their hands and toys in the tank and kill all of my fish. Thirteen-year-old-me drew up a "contract" – complete with legalese – and made my 9 year old brother sign it. The "contract" included phrases like "hereby proclaim" and "evidence thereof." It basically said that if my brother put his fingers or toys in the fish tank, that he would buy me a lid for the tank that locked. He actually signed it on the blank I drew for him, with his name printed below the blank. So...apparently being a nerd has been a lifetime journey for me, and not something that happened in college or law school. Thankfully my mom saved the "contract," because I have laughed at it more than once.

I realize that today we have moved away from "paper" snail-mail letters, to e-mails, texting, and tweets. I cannot recall the last time I hand-wrote a letter that was not a birthday card or a thank you note. Most of our photographs are in our phones and on our computer, now. Will those who go behind us go through our computers? Or just wipe the hard drive and give the computer to charity? Are we preserving memories and family history in a meaningful way if our only correspondence is





## From Marshall To Moussaoui:

Federal Justice in the Eastern District of Virginia

From Marshall to Moussaoui: Federal Justice in the Eastern District of Virginia artfully traces the precedential decisions of a court that has made a rich contribution to the history of our Constitution. John Peters' book is well-researched, informative and quite entertaining.

John O. Peters' work entitled *From Marshall to Moussaoui: Federal Justice in the Eastern District of Virginia* is quite an accomplishment. Through the historical lens the reader quickly is transported to the times of the anecdotes that are sprinkled liberally across the pages. The U.S. District Court comes alive as Peters focuses the reader's attention on the brilliance – and the human foibles – of the jurists who have presided over cases that range from treason and trespass, to liquor and libel, and from civil war to civil rights. Collectively, the judges, lawyers and litigants personify the history of this important court of justice. It is also a rich and robust reflection of the history of America.




