Please indicate your selection on your application. Applications are available in the Clerk's Office and the courtrooms, or will be mailed upon request.

The following is a list of criteria that will be considered when evaluating each applicant for the Court-Appointed Attorney List:

- 1. Certification by the Virginia Indigent Defense Commission to represent persons charged with misdemeanor, felony and juvenile offenses;
- 2. Inclusion on the Norfolk Circuit Court-Appointed List and willingness to affirmatively pursue appeals at all levels;
- 3. Years of trial experience;
- 4. Proximity of the attorney's office to the courthouse and availability/accessibility to clients;
- 5. Timely investigation of the case and trial preparation;
- 6. Willingness and ability to comply with the Code of Professional Responsibility;
- 7. Record of prior disciplinary action, and
- 8. Any other relevant considerations.

SPECIAL NOTICE

The following is a list of criteria that will be considered when evaluating each applicant for the Guardian Ad Litem Attorney List:

- 1. Certification by the Supreme Court of Virginia as a Guardian Ad Litem for children;
